Can you imagine needing heart surgery as a young baby? Well, that's just what Praada needed, and CARE was grateful to be able to help save this cutie! Praada was born with a condition known as Persistent Right Aortic Arch (PRAA). All dogs (and people too!) have a left aorta as adults, but during embryonic development a right aorta is present as well. This vessel should recede prior to birth, but when it doesn't disappear, this vessel constricts the esophagus so no food can pass. Praada was unable to keep any food down at all during her first several weeks of life. Emergency surgery was performed by Dr. Brumfield at Northwood Animal Hospital on March 5th to ligate and remove the offending band of tissue. Praada recovered even more quickly than we expected her to – she was playing ball within 10 days of her big surgery! Praada was quickly adopted into a wonderful home, where she is now known as Praava.

His mother and the rest of his litter were found dead, attacked by an unknown animal, only little Nemo survived.
